Roedown farm has been in existence since approximately 1760 and under the Bulmer's ownership has become a farm focused on developing sustainable practices. Mark and his wife Elizabeth board horses and grow hay. They also make homemade jams, jellies, baked goods and pickles. Roedown farm is home to many best management practices including 3.6 acres of forage harvest management, 3.6 hayland, and 111.5 of pasture. The farm also has two ponds.

Beyond boarding horses and growing hay Roedown Research R² was developed following the series of natural disasters in recent years to explore water, energy and food security as infrastructure vulnerabilities to weather events. The Bulmers are committed to being environmentally friendly in their operation and use low energy light bulbs, practice recycle and even use environmentally sustainable paint.
