Shamrock Arabian Farm was first incorporated in 1981 in Franklin County, Missouri. A life long passion for the Arabian horse prompted the formal beginnings of the farm when Bill and Barbara McDonald moved to Missouri in 1980 after Bill completed his tour of duty with the US Navy. What started out as three mares, continued to grow with the addition of a stallion in 1987, Shamrock Khorvett, bred by the McDonalds. Khorvett has sired class A and regional champion get and in 2003 was a top 15 stallion at the Arabian Sport Horse National Championship Show in Lexington, Virginia.

Upon moving to Maryland in 1997, the McDonald's acquired another stallion on permanent lease, Gai-Adine++, a national top ten stallion in Hunter Over Fences as well as possessing several class A championships in three other performance divisions.

Today the farm has expanded its breeding concepts to include registered part Arabians that are used for showing and breeding. The farm is comprised of 14 horses, including two breeding stallions and several purebred and partbred mares. As the farm continues to grow and change, Barbara has reached out into the area of judging, having judged in Iowa, Missouri, Illinois, Maryland and Oklahoma.
