Sagamore Farm



Sagamore Farm was established in 1925 by Issac Emerson, the inventor of Bromo-Seltzer. The property was bequeathed to Alfred G. Vanderbilt II for his 21st birthday in 1933 by his mother Margaret. Alfred became the owner and president of Baltimore's Pimlico Race Course. Sagamore Farm's best known racehorses were Bahram, Discovery, Bed o'Roses, Ka-uai King, and Native Dancer.

In 2007 Maryland native Kevin Plank, CEO of Under Armour apparel company, bought the farm with a long term plan for a major restoration that includes a historic 90-stall training barn with a quarter-mile interior track and a three-quarter-mile Tapeta training track, which is partly made of recycled Under Armour shirts. On November 5, 2010, a Sagamore Farm owned horse named Shared Account won the \$2 million Breeders Cup Fillies and Mares race.

Sagamore Farm has implemented extensive conservation practices throughout the years including stream fencing, heavy use areas, and waste storage and management.
